

Newtown – What remains after all is lost?

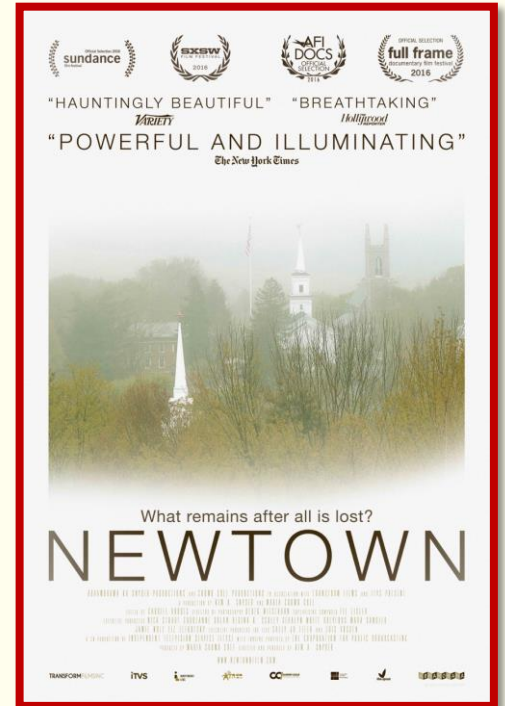
Filmed over the course of 3 years, the filmmakers use unique access and never-before-heard testimonies to tell a story of the aftermath of the Sandy Hook tragedy.
