


MAGICAL TALE TRAILS

The **STORYWALK®** phenomenon was created by Anne Ferguson and Rachel Senechal from the Kellogg-Hubbard Library in Vermont, to initiate an activity that would keep families moving. The result is a worldwide literary movement: **STORY-WALKS®** have sprouted up by the hundreds across the globe.
